Since then he has studied and performed improv with: Annoyance Theater, Chicago; Bay Area Improv Theatre (BAIT), Tampa; Comedy Buffet, Winter Haven, FL; Dear Aunt Gertrude, Ybor City, FL; iO (improv Olympics), Chicago; The Second City, Chicago and L.A. and the Upright Citizens Brigade, New York.

Larry is currently a student at the Performer's Studio Workshop in Tampa, studying the Eric Morris Process (adapted) with Kathy Laughlin, CSA. Larry is working on the "Five Things an Actor Needs Before Moving to L.A." list and waiting for more of his acting friends, or rather, friends who are actors, move to California so he can crash at their places when he ventures westward.
